MINUTES

SANGAMON COUNTY BOARD

OCTOBER 13, 2009

The Sangamon County Board met in Reconvened Adjourned September Session on October 13, 2009 in the County Board Chambers. Chairman VanMeter called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Montalbano gave the Invocation and Mr. Hall led the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Chairman VanMeter asked the Clerk to call the roll. There were 26 Present – 3 Absent. Mr. Davsko, Ms. Dillman, and Mrs. Fulgenzi were excused.

PROCLAMATIONS

Mr. Smith presented a Proclamation in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Mr. Preckwinkle presented a Proclamation to the Sangamon County Sheriff's K-9 Unit. Those present were: Sheriff Neil Williamson, Sgt. Dan Parrish, Deputy Jeff VanHoos and "Jaro", Deputy Brian Stapleton and "Zaso", and Deputy Drew Dickason and "Dino". Sheriff Williamson stated that 50 years ago they did not have the K-9 program and today they have one of the finest teams in the Midwest. Sheriff Williamson thanked the County for their support, and thanked the men and their K-9 partners for their hard work and dedication. He recognized Sgt. Dan Parrish for his hard work and dedication, for which they would not be here tonight.

Mr. Smith and Mr. Hall presented a Proclamation in recognition of all the responders and emergency personnel who gave their time to help the Villages of Loami and Williamsville to recover from the tornados on August 19, 2009.

PRESENTATION FROM THE F.O.P.

Becky Dragoo, residing at 974 Clocktower Drive in Springfield, addressed the Board. She stated that she is present and is speaking on behalf of the Sheriff's Deputies. The K-9 Unit is the last specialty unit left standing in the Sheriff's Department. Earlier this year the County asked them to fill an over \$850,000 gap in the Sheriff's Department's budget. This came with a personal and economic sacrifice to the deputies. They agreed to work 12 hour schedules. They have done an admirable job, and they have done more than their part with the overtime savings. The specialty units that were abolished were the Drug Investigation Response Team, Crime Prevention Program, Warrants Team, and the Traffic Unit.

They also understand there is a chance they will be cutting the budget even further. There is just nothing else to give. Personnel would be the only thing left to cut, but with that they will not be able to provide the services they do now. When someone calls for service from other communities in the County, the Sheriff's Deputies will not be able to respond like they do now. This would be truly unfortunate. She stated that she believes if they ask the citizens of this community what the most important service they could provide is, it would safety. They would be cutting services in communities such as Loami, Williamsville, Buffalo, Cantrall, Divernon, Grandview, and Illiopolis. These are communities in the County they have an obligation to represent and offer these valuable services to. If this budget is cut and they eliminate personnel, they will not have the manpower to staff 12-hour shifts. Sheriff's Deputies that came on duty tonight at 6:30 p.m. will get off tomorrow morning at 6:00 a.m., and if they have to work overtime they will be working 18 hours.

The Sheriff has spoken to the County Board about the Public Safety Tax. There have been comments made about it being dead on arrival, but the County has not even tried this with the citizens of this County. She stated that she feels the County Board has an obligation to do so when they are talking about public safety. They could not just take another 5% cut. There are men and women here in the room tonight that would be laid off as a result of cutting the budget. She asked that they go back and prioritize what services they provide to the citizens of this community. Law enforcement and protection of citizens, property, and children should be at the top of that list.

Chairman VanMeter stated that he and his colleagues here tonight do express their appreciation to these deputies.

REPORTS OF COUNTY OFFICIALS, STANDING COMMITTEES, AND SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Mr. Goleman gave a report from the Finance Committee. He reminded everyone that they are in the process of meeting with all the department heads to look at their budgets, comments, and suggestions.

He stated that two years ago he said to everyone "the perfect storm is upon them". He stated that he thinks they are correct. They have done a lot to prepare for this. The Finance Committee will be meeting on October 27, 2009 and October 28, 2009 to make some recommendations and formulate a budget to present at the next County Board meeting in November. He clarified to everyone that they take this job very serious as they represent everyone in Sangamon County. He also reminded them their obligation is to also look at the big picture, and see where they have to allocate the funds necessary to run County government. They are going to be making some tough choices and they are elected to do that. They are in unprecedented times, and they have never seen an economy as poor as it is now, other than the Great Depression. They understand it is not good out there, but this County is in a lot better financial shape than other governmental bodies because they continue to plan and prepare for the future. They are pro-active rather than re-active. They will continue to do this and will take their shots. They work at this very hard and listen to all the input. In the final analysis, they will come up with a budget that is in the best interest of all the residents of Sangamon County. He asked for help from everyone to work with the Finance Committee because they have some tough decisions to make.
